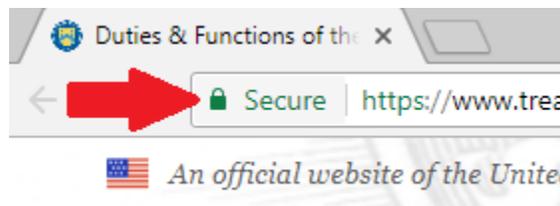


Instructions on obtaining the latest Public Treasury.gov Certificate

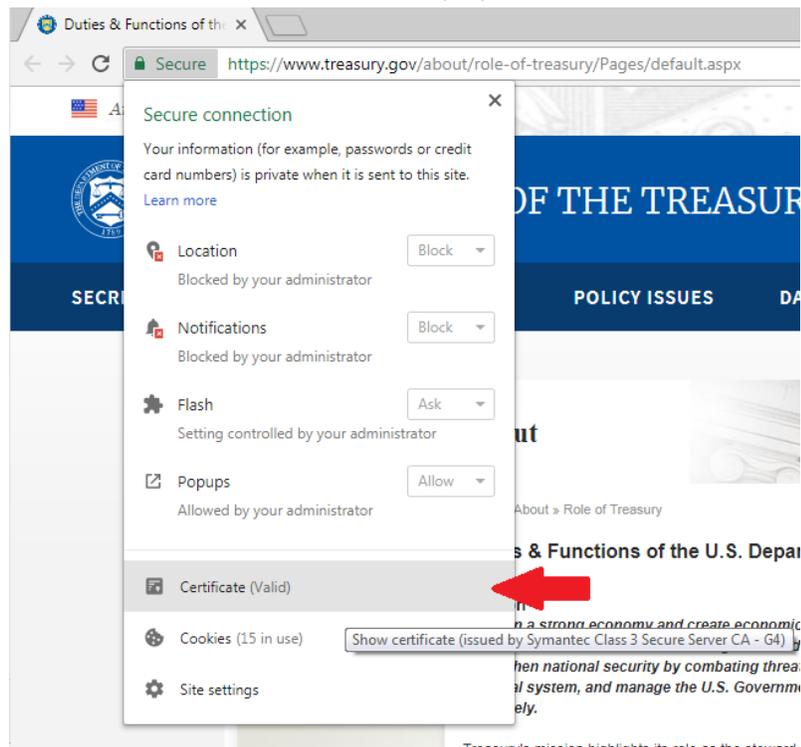
- **Browser (Chrome – version 60 and up):**
 - Open up Chrome Web Browser and navigate to <https://www.treasury.gov/about/role-of-treasury/Pages/default.aspx>



- Next to the URL bar, click the Green Padlock with 'Secure.' A dropdown menu is displayed.



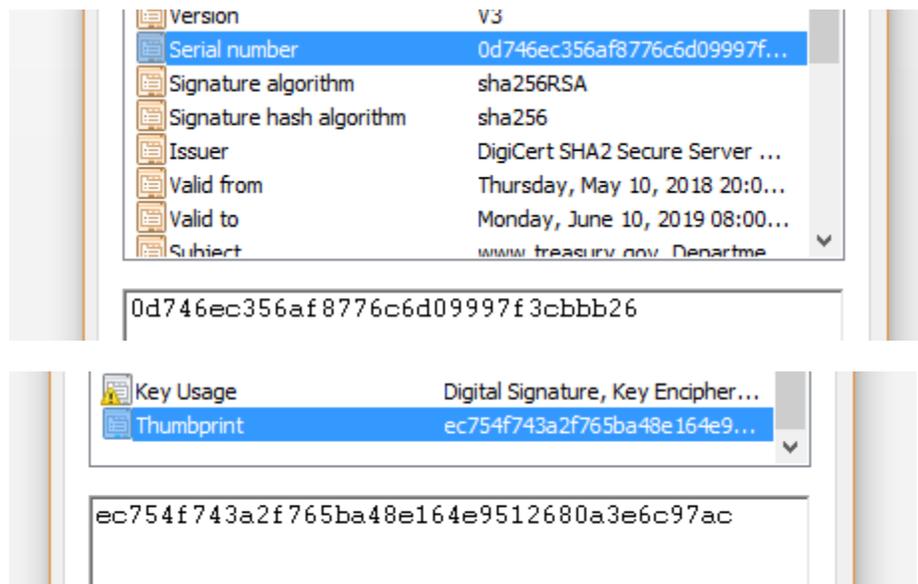
- Select Certificate. A certificate window is displayed



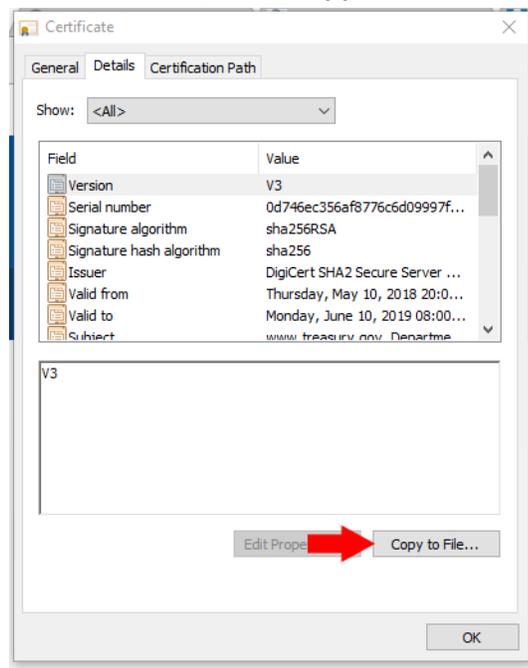
- Select the **Details** tab.



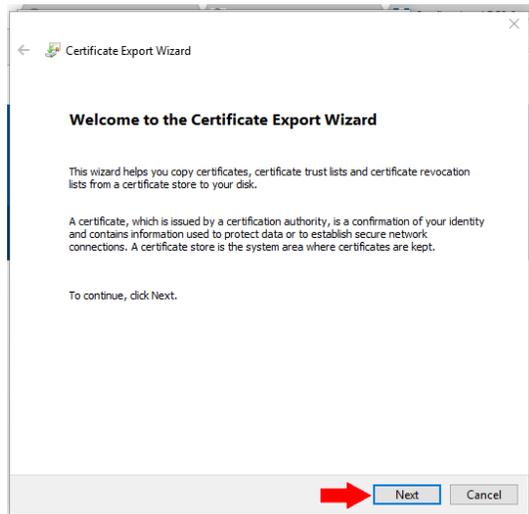
- Within this window, you can obtain all public information on the certificate, including serial number, thumbprint, and any other attributes required.



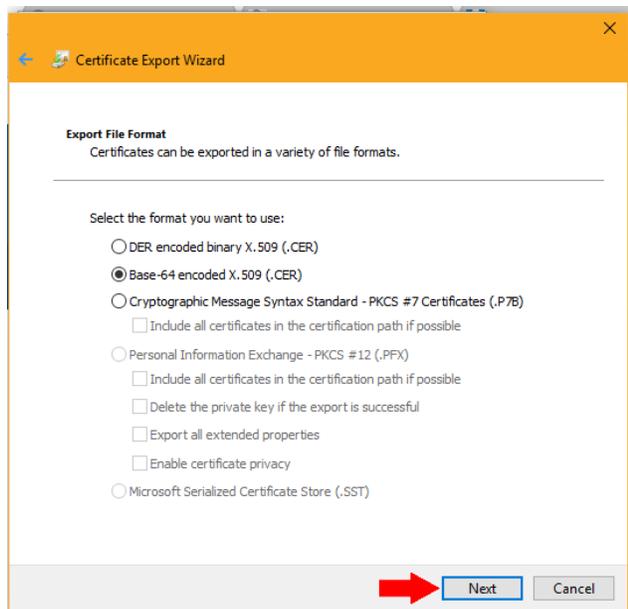
- To export the certificate, **Select Copy To File.**



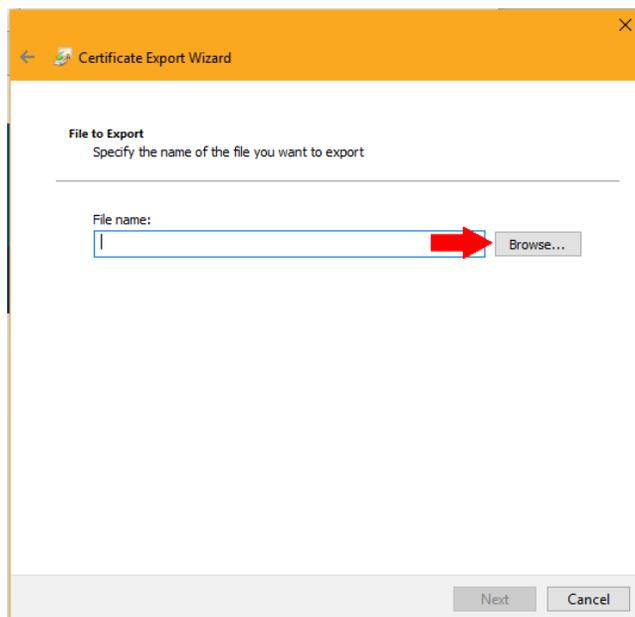
- A certificate export wizard window is displayed. **Click Next.**

- Type in a file name (e.g. www.treasury.gov) and Select Save

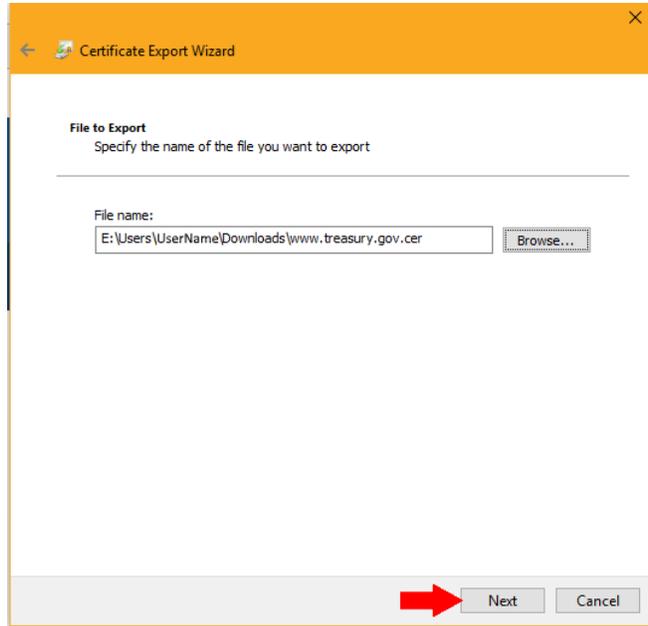

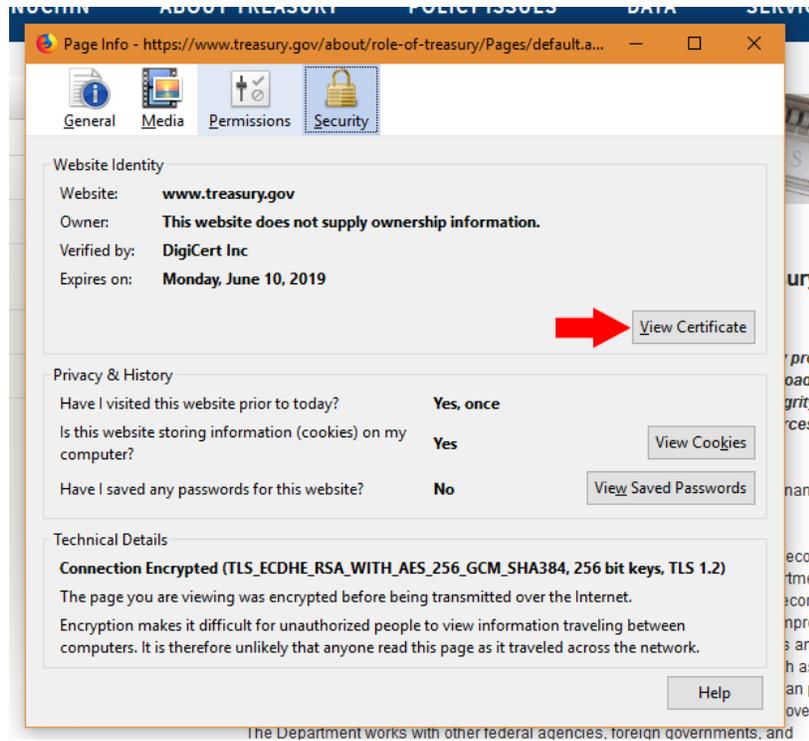
- Select the arrow button. An additional window is displayed



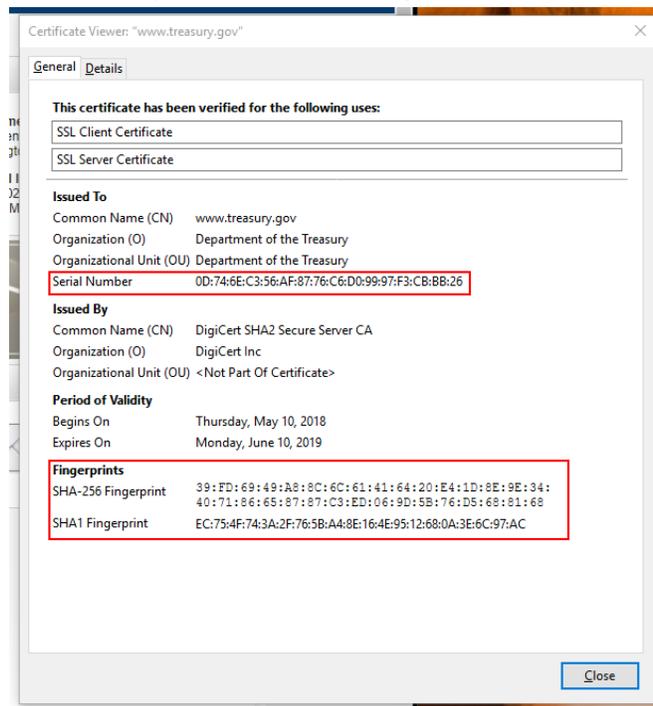
- Select More Information. A certificate window is displayed



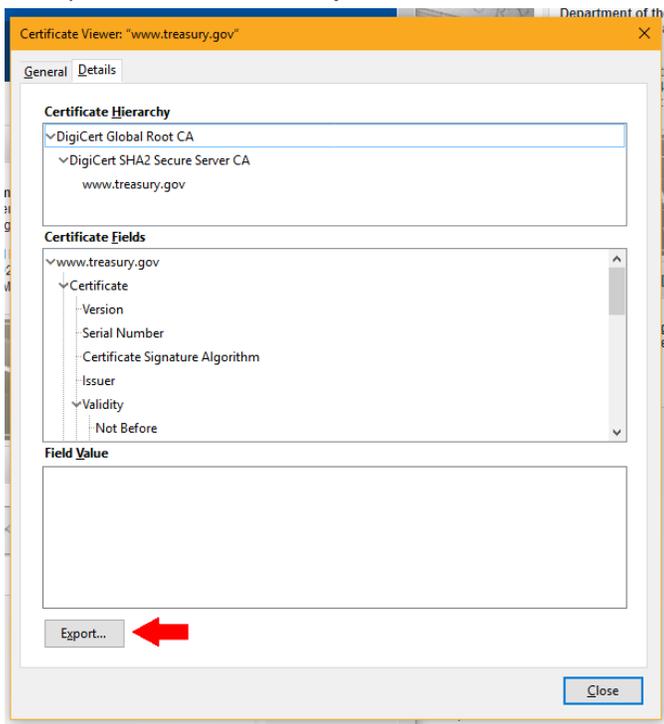
- **Select View Certificate.** A certificate window is displayed.



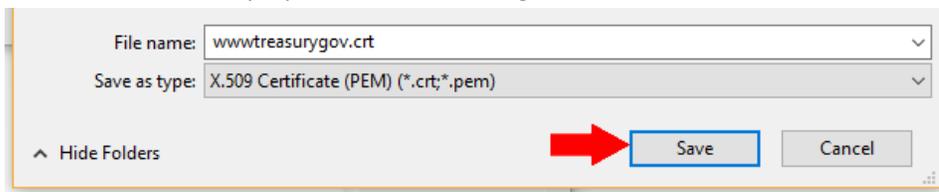
- **Within this window, you can obtain all public information on the certificate, including serial number, thumbprint, and any other attributes required.**



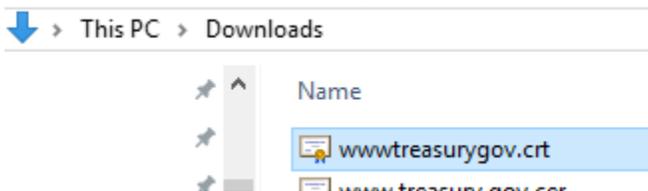
- To export the certificate, **Export**.



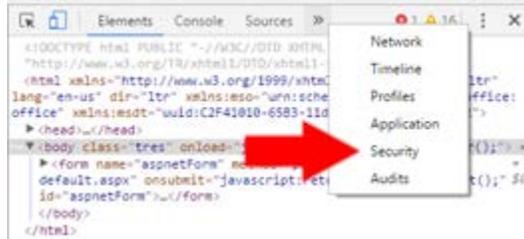
- A save window is displayed. Leave all settings as default and **Select Save**.



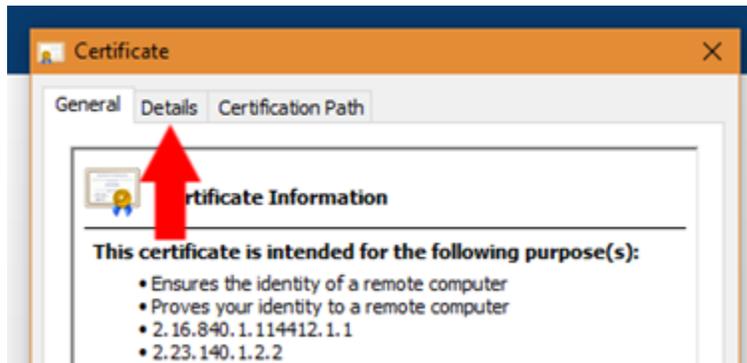
- The certificate will now be exported as a .crt and can be imported into applications.



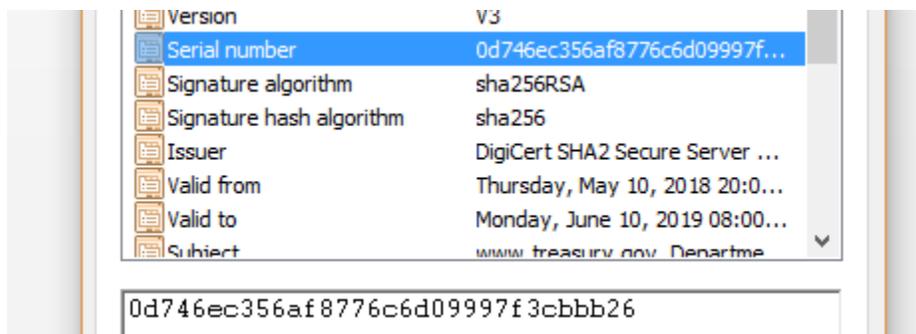
- **OLDER VERSIONS: Browser (Chrome – version 59 or earlier):**
 - Open up Chrome Web Browser and navigate to <https://www.treasury.gov/about/role-of-treasury/Pages/default.aspx>
 - **IMPORTANT:** www.treasury.gov redirects to <https://home.treasury.gov> and displays a separate certificate.
 - Press **F12** key. A developer window is displayed on the right hand side of the screen.
 - In the developer window, select the double '>>' symbol along the top border. A drop down menu is displayed. Select **Security**. A certificate window is displayed.



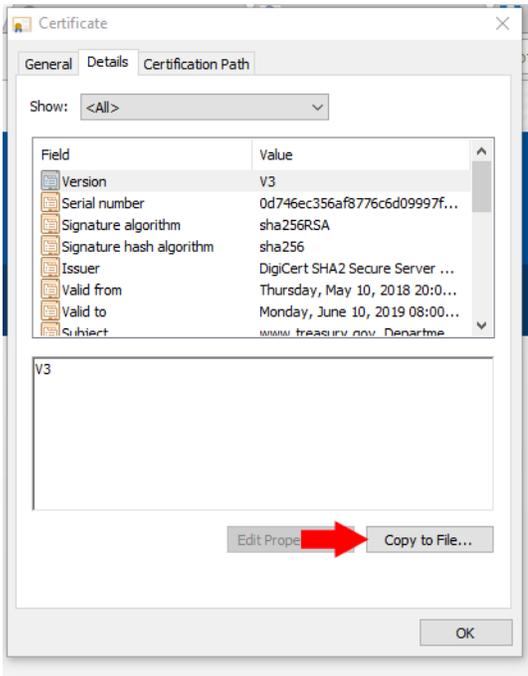
- Select the **Details** Tab.



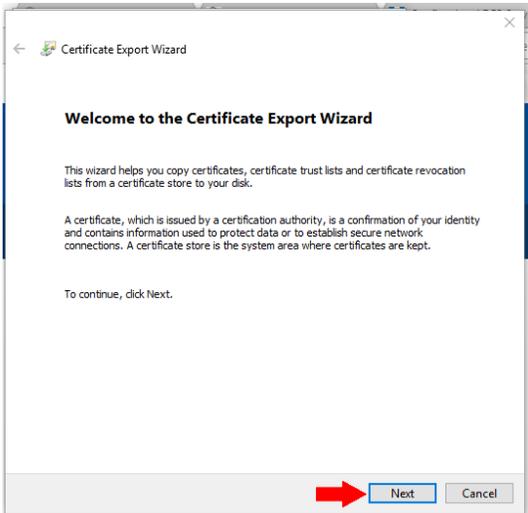

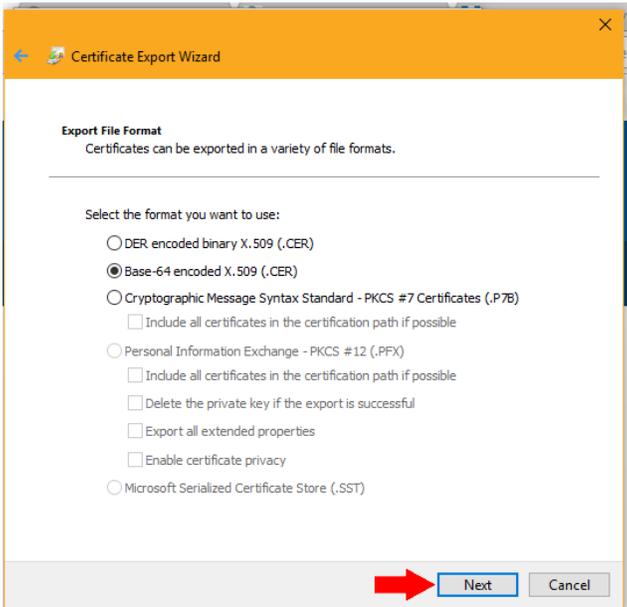
- To export the certificate, **Select Copy To File.**



- A certificate export wizard window is displayed. **Click Next.**

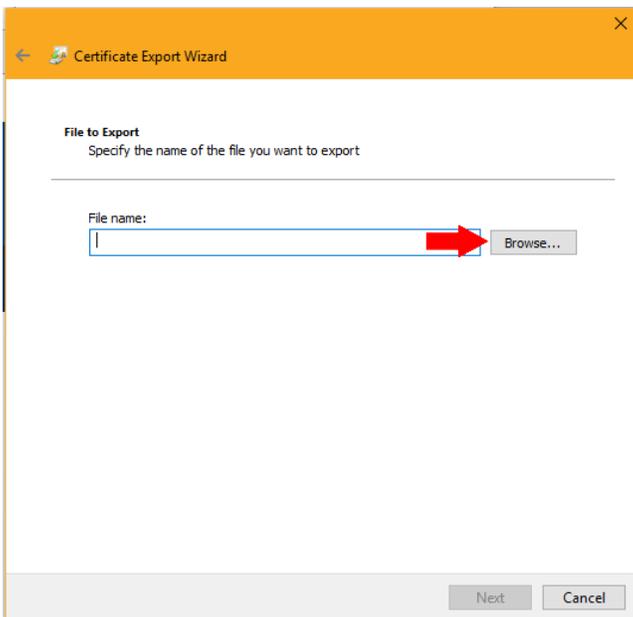
